# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The year 2015 marked a major transition for the National AIDS/STI Control Programme as Dr. Stephen Ayisi Addo (Public Health Specialist) was appointed the substantive Programme Manager by GHS Council following the successful retirement of Dr. Nii Akwei Addo after a meritorious service to the nation. It also marked a transition from the old grant (Round 8 Phase 2) to the New Funding Mechanism (NFM) of the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, TB and Malaria. It was a year of the old and new characterized by mixed fortunes in the implementation of HIV and STI prevention, treatment, care and support services.

The annual HIV Sentinel survey was undertaken successfully with a 2015 HIV prevalence of 1.8% as against that of 1.6% in 2014 and 1.9% in 2013 amongst pregnant women attending Antenatal Care. Syphilis Prevalence dropped from 0.6% to 0.1%, and HIV prevalence amongst STI clients also reduced from 4.2% in 2014 to 3.2% (2015 HIV Sentinel Survey Report, May 2016).

A total of Nine hundred and fifty five thousand, six hundred and seventy four (955,674) out of a target of two million, five hundred and seventeen thousand, nine hundred and eighty five persons (2,517,985) were tested for HIV; giving a 38% coverage. Approximately 11% were males (107,435), 16% were non-pregnant women and the remaining 73% were pregnant women. Two thousand three hundred and twenty five (2,325) sites provided PMTCT services in 2015.

The number of pregnant women tested and counselled for HIV and who received their results was six hundred and ninety four thousand, three hundred and twenty nine (694,329); 12,236 (1.8%) were positive and 7,813 (64% of positives) were provided ARVs to Prevent Mother-To-Child Transmission of HIV (PMTCT).

In 2015, 694,329 pregnant women out of a targetted 869,677 got to know their HIV sero-status. This represents 80% coverage of targetted pregnancies and 68% of the year's 1,023,150 expected pregnancies.

In the course of the year, the Programme organised refresher trainings in PMTCT/EID in service delivery areas for health workers following the adoption of the WHO PMTCT option B Plus guidelines. This was to ensure lifelong therapy for all HIV positive Mothers for their own health and as prophylaxis for their babies irrespective of CD4 count and WHO clinical stage. Three thousand seven hundred and thirty three (3,733) HIV exposed infants received Early Infant Diagnosis (EID), 9% of whom were positive (339).

A total number of sixteen thousand, nine hundred and sixty eight (16,968) adults and children were newly initiated on ART in 2015, (4,444 males and 12,524 females) in 199 sites. The target for the year was fourteen thousand, one hundred and seventy seven 14,177. As at the end December 31st approximately 82,000 clients out a projected 89,000 were on ART following a data cleaning and census exercise. About Ninety five thousand clients have ever been initiated on ART since 2003 till December 2015. A cohort assessment of ART clients was also initiated successfully in September 2015 to affirm the overall retention rate of clients in ART care.

The TB/HIV Collaboration continued and in 2015, the number of PLHIV who were screened for TB symptoms was sixty three thousand, eight hundred and twenty six (63,826) as against that of forty nine thousand, three hundred and forty three (49,343) in 2014. There were one thousand and ninety six (1,096) HIV Positive Clients with TB on ART. One Hundred and fifty DOTS corners were assessed out of which 112 were potentially found to be viable for capacity building to offer ART in Ashanti, Eastern, Greater Accra and Western Regions.

Under the Cooperative Agreement (COAG) between the Ghana Health Service and United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Programme procured two chemistry and two haematology analysers, 12 heavy duty UPS (8kVA) , 10 heavy duty stabilisers (10kVA). 265 facilities were enrolled in the Dried Tube Proficiency testing programme and Basic Laboratory Information System (BLIS) were deployed in 16 facilities by December 2015.

Two support visits were undertaken to the Volta Region and Upper East Regions by the Acting Programme Manager and these were complemented by monitoring visits to all other regions to review the comprehensive package and progress of implementation for HIV prevention, treatment, care and support services in Ghana.

Apart from the perennial gaps in testkits supply for the general population, high human resource attrition and weak infrastructure, the Programme suffered a major setback with the Burning of Central Medical Stores (CMS) in Tema leading to destruction of HIV commodities and further weakening of the supply chain system.

The National AIDS/STI Control Programme would sustain collaboration with other Divisions and Programmes to ensure a more integrated service delivery to improve coverage whilst ensuring ownership and sustainability within the health system.

During the year the Global Fund approved a total amount of \$79,460,735.76 under the New Funding model (NFM) for the period July 2015 to December 2017.

The Programme received a total disbursement of \$25,015,246.29 in 2015 (January - December) from funding partners; the Global Fund provided 98% of the total funds whilst other donors such as CDC and UNICEF contributed 2% of total receipts.

The National AIDS/STI Control Programme is optimistic that additional funding and technical assistance from partners and Government would significantly improve indicators in 2016 and position the country to fully implement aspirational global initiatives such as the 90/90/90.

The programme is appreciative of all the support from the, DG-GHS, Director PHD, MOH, GAC, Development Partners, other government & non-governmental stakeholders, service providers and the association of PLHIV. Our focus is to work together till we attain zero new infections, deaths, stigma and discrimination.

## INTRODUCTION

The National AIDS/STI Control Programme (NACP), a Programme under the Disease Control and Prevention Department of the Public Health Division of the Ghana Health Service (GHS), is responsible for the coordination and implementation of the HIV and AIDS related aspects of the Ghana Health Sector Strategic Framework.

### 1.1 Brief History of NACP

The Programme started as the National Technical Committee on AIDS and later became National Advisory Council on HIV and AIDS in 1985. The Council changed into NACP in 1987 and has since been the main technical agency in the health sector's response to HIV and AIDS in Ghana.

The NACP first developed a Short Term Plan for the prevention and control of HIV and AIDS in 1987, as an efficient method to the National Response and went on to develop two Medium Term Plans; one from 1989 to 1993 and the other from 1996 to 2000. The NACP later employed the health sector component of the National HIV Strategic Framework (NSF I 2001-2005 & NSF II 2006-2010) and is currently responsible for implementing the health sector aspects of the National HIV and AIDS Strategic Plan (NSP 2011-2015). Additionally, the Programme has been guided by the Health Sector Programme of Work.

The National AIDS/STI Control Programme is mandated to undertake the following activities:

1. The delivery of a package of interventions to reduce HIV transmission.
2. The delivery of a package of care and support services for Persons Living with HIV (PLHIV).
3. The delivery of Strategic Information on HIV and AIDS and other STIs.
4. The provision of essential technical support to all Ministries, Departments and Agencies (MDAs) in the implementation of their HIV programmes.

The 2015 Annual Report documents activities and projects undertaken in the course of the year under the following broad performance areas.

- HIV Testing Services (Including Behaviour Change Communication, Condom promotion and Information, Education and Communication)

- Elimination of Mother-To-Child Transmission (EMTCT) services
- Antiretroviral Therapy
- HIV TB Collaboration
- Laboratory and Health Information System Strengthening and other COAG Activities
- The Delivery of Strategic Information on HIV and AIDS
- Technical Support to Ministries, Department, Agencies and Stakeholders
- Financial resource mobilization and utilization
- Programme Management and Quality Assurance (Administration, reviews, monitoring and supervision)
- Challenges and wayforward.

## THE PACKAGE OF INTERVENTIONS TO REDUCE HIV TRANSMISSION

NACP's primary obligation is to reduce new HIV infections. A number of interventions including the provision of HIV Testing and Counselling (HTC) and Prevention of Mother-To-Child Transmission (PMTCT) of HIV services were therefore undertaken during the period under review.

This section's focus is on the activities that took place within the package of interventions to reduce HIV transmission in the year 2015. These are:

- HIV Testing and Counselling
- Prevention of Mother-To-Child Transmission of HIV
- Sexually Transmitted Infection Management
- Condom Promotion and Distribution
- Blood Safety
- Advocacy, Communication and Social Mobilization for Demand Creation

### 2.1 HIV Testing and Counselling

HIV Testing and Counselling (HTC) services create an opening for as many persons as possible to be offered the opportunity to know more about HIV and AIDS and check their sero-status so they can make informed decisions about their sexual and reproductive health. HTC forms the entry point to anti-retroviral treatment which in effect helps to prevent new infections and/or re-infection among the general population.

In 2015, a total of Nine hundred and fifty five thousand, six hundred and seventy four (955,674) out of a target of Two million, five hundred and seventeen thousand, nine hundred and eighty five persons (2,517,985) were tested for HIV. This figure represents 38% of the expected HTC services target for the year. The gap in testkit commodity was one million due to significant cuts in Government budgetary allocation to the health sector. The HIV prevalence among the HTC clients was 4.8% compared to 6% in 2014 and 5.6% for 2013. Table 2.1 shows number of persons tested and counselled for HIV in 2015, whilst table 2.2 shows regional coverage. Table 2.3 shows the trend of persons tested and counselled from 2013 to 2015.

Regional Coverage for HIV Testing and Counseling for 2015

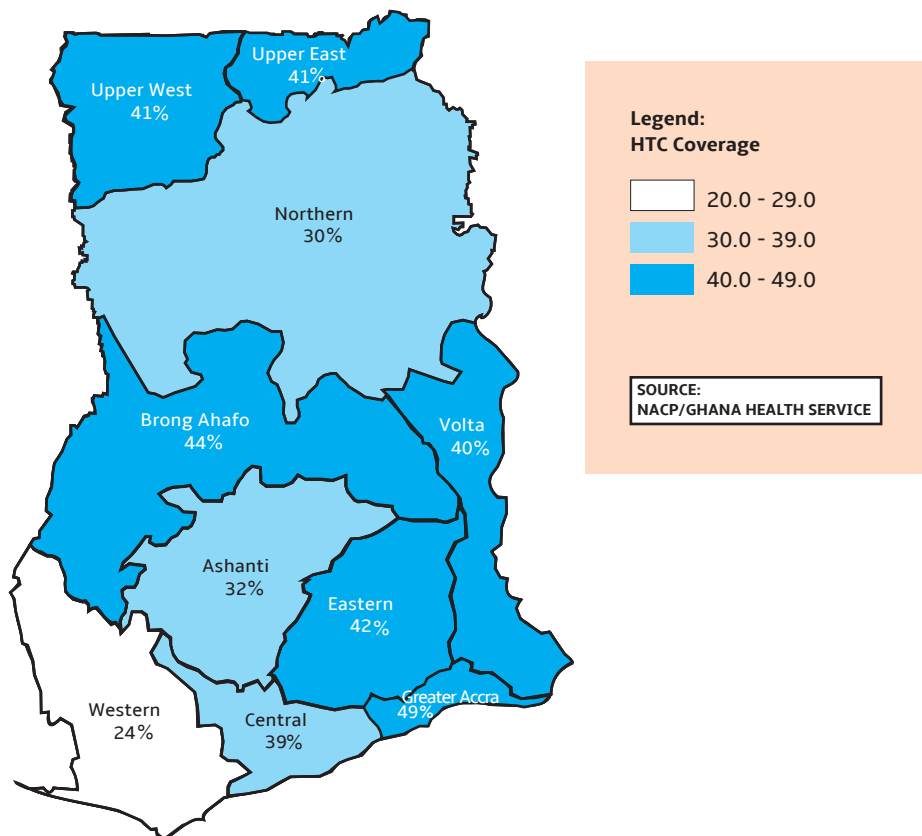
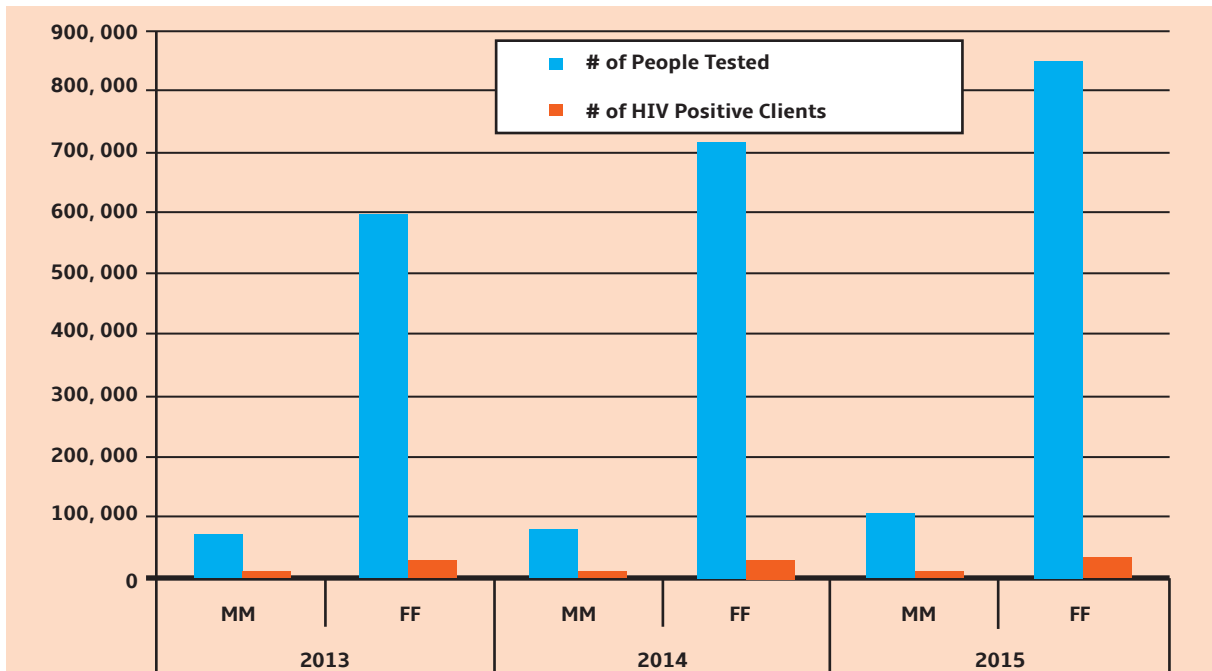

## 2.2 Prevention of Mother-To-Child Transmission (PMTCT)

In 2015, two thousand three hundred and twenty five (2,325) health facilities provided PMTCT of HIV services. Ghana uses the four-pronged approach in providing the package of interventions to reduce the risk of MTCT of HIV towards the elimination target of less than 5% transmission rate from mother-to-child. The various activities undertaken in the year 2015 under the four prongs were as follows:

### 2.2.1 Prong One: Primary Prevention

All service delivery points encouraged pregnant women to know their HIV sero-status in order to reduce the risk of transmission of the virus, from mother to baby as a key component of Prevention of Mother-To-Child Transmission service delivery.

In 2015, 694,329 pregnant women out of 869,677 targetted pregnancies learnt of their HIV sero-status representing 80% of the year's target. This coverage represents 68% of 1,023,150 expected pregnancies in Ghana. Provision of post-test and continuous counselling was offered to all clients to emphasize the need to avoid HIV infection.

It is important to note that in line with the country’s protocol, all those who tested negative were retested at 34 weeks to identify anybody who had sero-converted within the intervening period.

Table 2.4 shows percentage of HIV positive pregnant women in the regions. In 2015, of the six hundred and ninety four thousand, three hundred and twenty nine (694,329) pregnant women tested, twelve thousand, two hundred and thirty six (12,236) were found to be HIV positive (1.8%). Three Thousand seven hundred and seventy (3, 770) pregnant women were found to be HIV positive during retesting. This figure is overestimated with respect to the number retested at 34 weeks due to misunderstanding of that indicator. The tool does not have the indicator “number retested at 34 weeks”. This challenge also results in an underestimation of the actual number of negative pregnant women retested at 34 weeks of gestation. This will be corrected in the newly revised integrated ANC/PMTCT register.

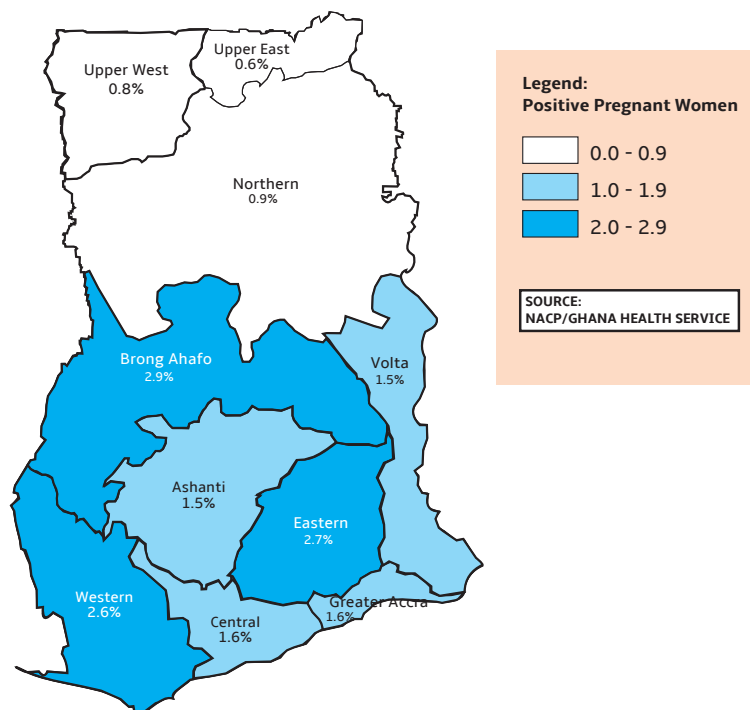

• 2.2.2 **Prong Two: Prevention of Unintended Pregnancies**

In collaboration with Family Health Division of the Ghana Health Service, Family planning (FP) services were offered as part of ANC and undertaken in all service delivery points. Women accessing PMTCT services received Family Planning counselling and were provided with or linked to services where necessary during the ante-natal and post-natal periods. HIV positive non-pregnant women were also referred for Family Planning services. Detailed data on provision of Family Planning can be retrieved from the Reproductive and Child Health Unit (RCH) of the Family Health Division (FHD) of the Ghana Health Service.

• 2.2.3 **Prong Three: Provision of PMTCT Interventions**

Ghana initially had a single ARV, then adopted the dual anti-retroviral prophylaxis for PMTCT in 2008 (Option A) and updated its protocol in 2010 to triple ARVs for HIV positive pregnant women (Option B) to further reduce Mother-to-Child Transmission (MTCT) rates up to 12 months post natal. In July 2015 the protocol was revised to option B plus, where lifelong triple ART is given to all HIV positive pregnant women for their own health whilst ensuring the elimination of MTCT.

Out of these 12,236 positive pregnant women (Table 2.4), 7,813 representing 64% received ARVs as either prophylaxis or treatment.

Table 2.6 shows the trend for PMTCT uptake and intervention including the provision of ARVs from 2011 to 2015.

As shown in table 2.6 above, more pregnant women were tested for HIV in 2015 compared to 2014. The number of positive women also increased. However, the percentage of positive women who were put on ARVs reduced.

• 2.2.4 **Prong Four: Provision of Treatment, Care and Support Services for Mothers, their Infants and Families**

The provision of Treatment, Care and Support Services continued to be part of the package of interventions targeted towards the mothers, their infants and families through the appropriate linkages to services. Activities included male involvement in PMTCT through the avenue of couple counselling and partner testing in some facilities. This intervention needs to be scaled up to enhance uptake of PMTCT at the community level.

Mothers and their infants were linked to appropriate services such as post-natal, family planning, nutrition and child welfare services and to ART centers for continued care and they were followed up for Early Diagnosis of HIV.

The regional distribution is as shown in table 2.7 and confirms gaps in service coverage in all regions. Table 2.7 shows that, Upper East Region had the highest coverage of facilities providing PMTCT services as 96% and the Central region had the lowest (31%). The average national coverage of PMTCT services is 62%.

• 2.2.5 Syphilis

To improve maternal and child health and specifically, for the purposes of preventing congenital syphilis, pregnant women who accessed PMTCT were screened for syphilis once they were being screened for HIV.

Syphilis Testing improved tremendously and more pregnant Syphilis positive mothers were treated with Benzathine Penicillin.

All health facilities providing PMTCT services were given Syphilis test kits to ensure all pregnant women were tested at the same time for both Syphilis and HIV. This was to eliminate the barriers to screening when conducted in the laboratory. In spite of that, fewer women were tested for syphilis than HIV. In the year under review, 471,284 pregnant women were tested for syphilis and 96.9 % of those found positive were treated together with their partners.

The Programme’s goal is to achieve parity with HIV testing and a 100% treatment of all clients tested positive for syphilis.

• 2.2.6 Capacity Building for E-MTCT

In the year under review, the Programme undertook option B plus refresher trainings for One thousand, three hundred and forty five (1,345) health workers selected from service delivery areas throughout the country. This training which targeted midwives and child welfare nurses included Dried Blood Spot (DBS) sample taking for EID.

• 2.2.7 Early Infant Diagnosis of HIV

In the course of the year, the number of exposed babies screened for HIV in the various facilities was 3,733 as shown in Table 2.10 below:

In 2015 3,733 of HIV Exposed Infants were screened for HIV as compared to 2,878 in 2014. This represents only 31% of HIV exposed babies expected to be screened at least. Overall, 9% of the exposed babies in 2015 were found to be HIV positive compared to 8% in 2014. Delays in procurement and distribution of DBS kits and reagents coupled with frequent breakdowns in PCR machines due to power fluctuations posed great challenges for EID delivery. The Programme apart from the training of service providers, developed new EID registers to improve data collection and reporting in the ensuing year.

 **2.3 Condom Promotion and Distribution**

NACP collaborated with the Family Health Division (FHD) of the Ghana Health Service to distribute a total of 18,634,031 male and 273,399 female condoms. This activity was supported by MOH, USAID and UNFPA. Condom utilization coverage within the Public Health facilities is very low due to weak distribution and promotion. Its promotion was also significantly reduced as a result of a discontinuation of active outreach testing and the 'Know Your Status (KYS) campaigns'. The Programme together with stakeholders notably the FHD, GAC and the National Population Council (NPC) developed a condoms and lubricant strategy to address the problem of low condom demand.

## 2.4 Blood Safety

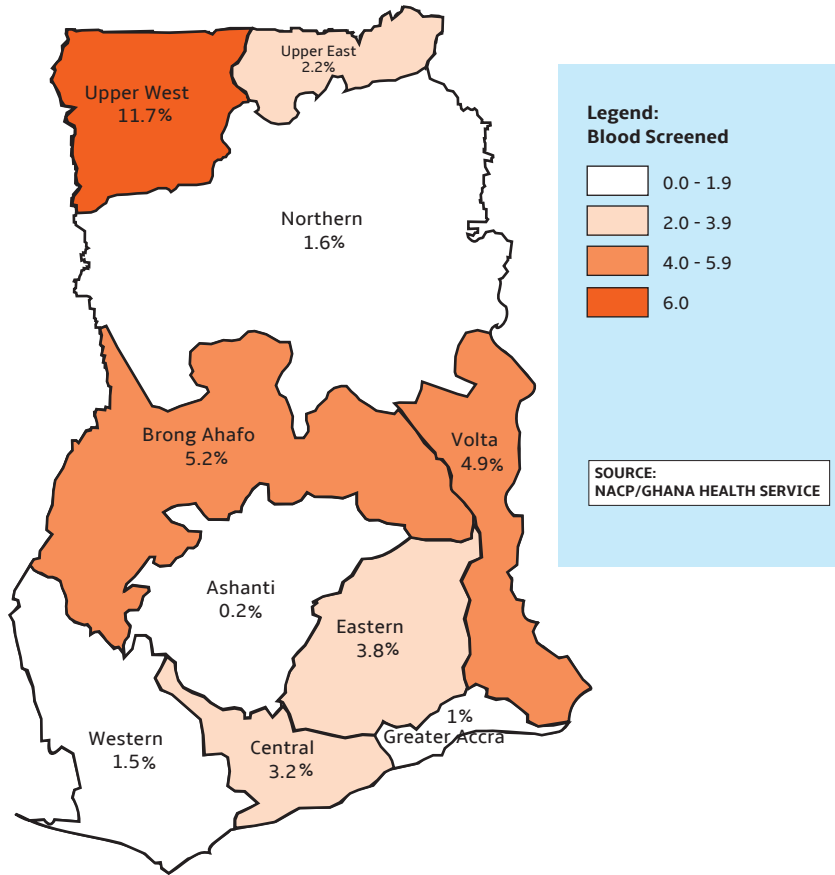
The Programme provided all health institutions with the necessary test kits for HIV screening in line with the national policy to ensure that all blood and blood products for transfusion are screened for HIV antibodies among other tests.

In the year under review, a total of 180,447 units of blood were screened for HIV throughout the country and 4,977, were found to be HIV reactive, giving a prevalence of 2.8%. The regional distribution is as shown in table 2.12 below.

**2.5 HIV Exposure Prevention in Health Care and other Settings**

Universal infection prevention measures were stressed in all training workshops and seminars as well as during monitoring and supervisory visits that the Programme organized as a means of reducing exposure to HIV. Also, health facilities were encouraged to display the protocols and contact numbers of persons capable of administering Post Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP).

In 2015, a total of 874 exposures were reported, 210 of which were rape related. Two persons tested positive during assessment. What is quite disturbing is that approximately 60% of reported cases were high-risk exposures.

## THE DELIVERY OF THE PACKAGE OF CARE AND SUPPORT SERVICES FOR PLHIV

The Programme's goal in the area of care and support is to improve quality of health and prolong the life of PLHIV. In order to make a significant change in the lives of PLHIV, NACP continued with the provision of ART.

### Interventions within this package include:

- Prevention and Management of Opportunistic Infections (OIs).
- Anti-Retroviral Therapy.
- Continuous Supportive Counselling.
- Effective Home Based Care.
- Working with PLHIV and their Associations.
- Greater Involvement of Persons Living with HIV and AIDS (GIPA).

### 3.1 Management of Opportunistic Infections

Opportunistic Infections are infections acquired when a person contracts HIV and their immune system is impaired. Opportunistic Infections need to be treated as much as possible before ART initiation.

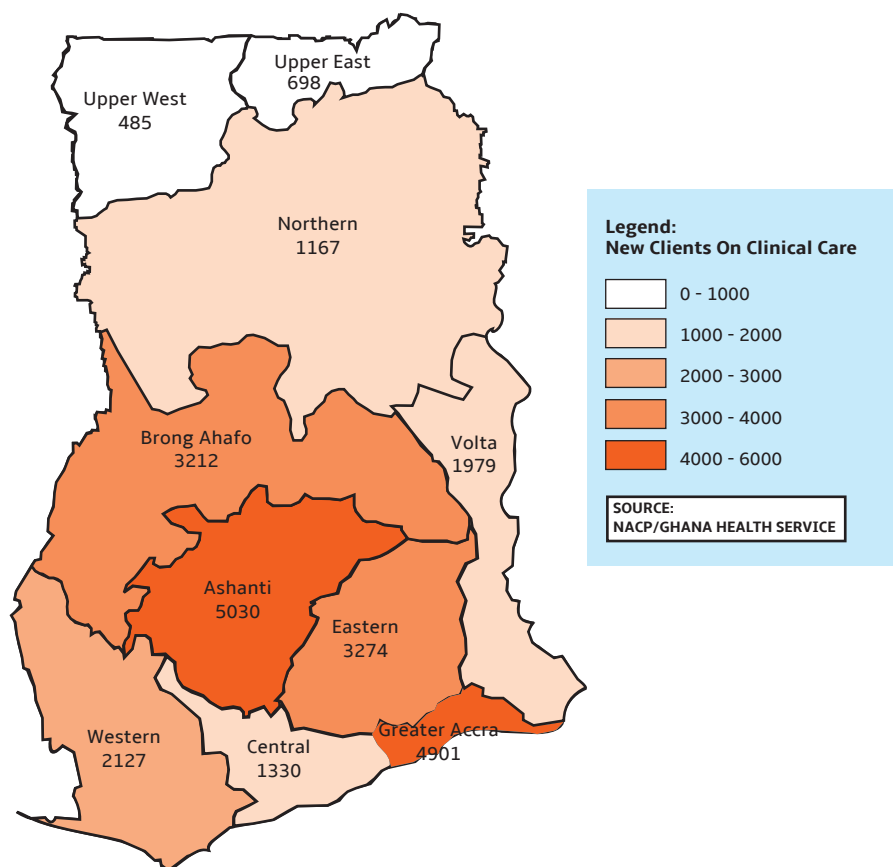
In order to prevent OIs in PLHIV, a total of 17,523 Persons were given OI medications (Co-trimoxazole prophylaxis) in 2015. These were made up 15,964 adults (4,684 males and 11,280 females) and 1,559 children (784 boys and 775 girls). In 2014, 17,854 PLHIV's were given OI medications.

Table 3.1 shows the regional totals of new clients receiving clinical care.

### 3.2 Anti Retroviral Therapy

The Programme continued with the provision of Anti-Retrovirals (ARVs) to Persons Living with HIV and AIDS (PLHIV) as part of its mandate to reduce morbidity and mortality among the infected and to prolong life. Currently, One Hundred and Ninety-Nine (199) health facilities are providing ART services which include 17 private self-financing facilities.

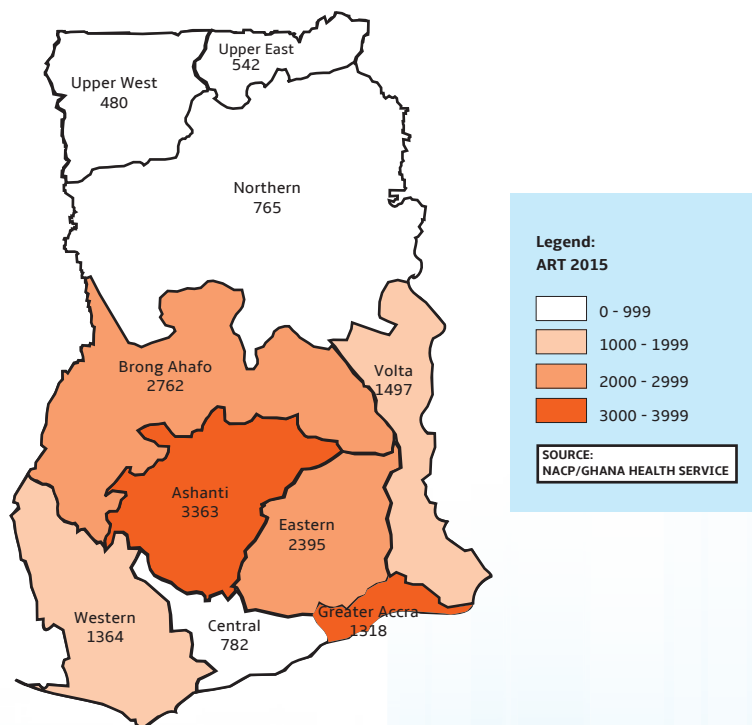
In the year under review, a total of 16,968 persons living with HIV, made up of 15,875 adults and 1,093 children, were enrolled on ART. The regional contributions are as follows:

At the end of 2015, a cumulative total of 89,113 PLHIV were active and on ARV medication. These are made up of 84,179 adults (59,795 females and 29,318 males) and 4,934 children made up of 4,581 girls and 353 boys.

By the end of the year 2015 a cumulative 1,706 clients on ART died. Sixty seven (67) of those on ART stopped treatment due to adverse clinical events. In addition, a cumulative 9,794 were declared as lost to follow-up as at December, 2015. In effect, 81,987 of PLHIVs ever initiated on ART are still alive and supporting the socio-economic development of the country. See table 3.3

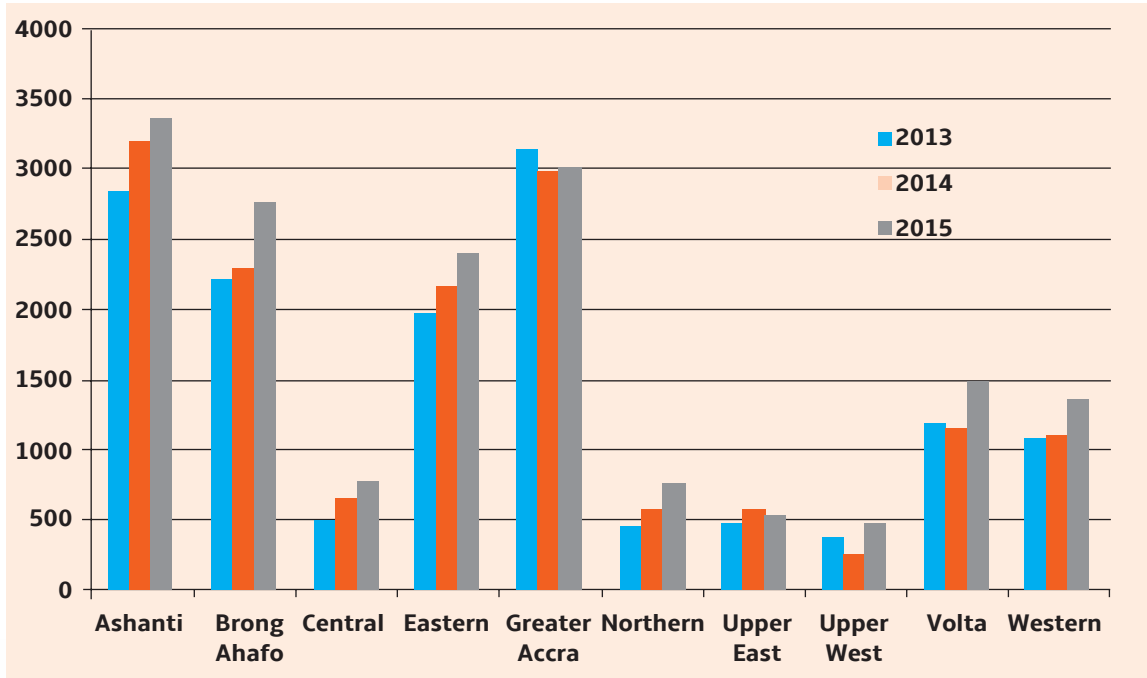

• 3.2.1 **TB and HIV Co-infection**

To ensure the comprehensive management of persons living with HIV, TB which is a common opportunistic infection is monitored. Every person with HIV is screened for TB at every clinic visit. In 2015, a total of 61,411 persons on ART were screened for TB, whereas 49,343 were screened in 2014. Again, 1,096 HIV positive persons with TB were put on antiretroviral therapy in 2015 as against 1,278 in 2014. Within the period 150 DOTs corners were assessed to build their capacity to provide ART within the context of HIV/TB collaboration.

• 3.2.2 **HIV Drug Resistance**

The National Expert Committee on HIV Drug Resistance continued to give guidance to NACP in the monitoring of HIVDR in the country. In 2015, the protocol for Acquired Drug Resistance survey was submitted for ethical clearance in line with Ghana’s HIVDR plan. Ethical clearance has been obtained from both Noguchi and the Ghana Health Service subject to feedback from the CDC. Early Warning Indicators were also disseminated and discussed with service providers at the annual review meeting.

## Chapter 4.0

### LABORATORY SYSTEMS STRENGTHENING /COAG ACTIVITIES

A number of activities were undertaken with funds provided by the US Government under the Co-operative Agreement between the Ghana Health Service and the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention, Atlanta. These activities were implemented by the National AIDS Control Programme in collaboration with the Institutional Care Division on behalf of the Ghana Health Service. Main activities undertaken were under the following broad headings:

#### ❖ 4.1 Proficiency Testing Programmes (PT)

• **4.1.1** There are nine PCR machines currently in operation in the country. However, eight laboratories with PCR machines carrying out Viral Load (VL) and Early Infant Diagnosis (EID) testing were enrolled in a Proficiency Testing Programme for testing VL and EID. At the time of enrolment, the PCR machine in the Upper East region had not been installed; there are plans to enrol the site before the next round of proficiency testing programme. The first set of panels were received and distributed to all sites; tests were run and sent to the provider and a feedback was received.

• **4.1.2** Dried Tube Specimen Proficiency Testing (DTSPT) for HIV rapid testing was introduced into the country under the Co-Ag in 2012 but had to be suspended because of numerous challenges. The programme was revamped on pilot basis in Greater Accra and Eastern regions. Two laboratories which attained 4 star rating by ASLM audit were selected and trained to prepare PT panels. Two rounds of proficiency testing programme were run for 200 selected testing sites in the two regions in January and November. Round 1 results were not very encouraging; analysis of Round 2 results is ongoing.

#### ❖ 4.2 Basic Laboratory Information System (BLIS)

• **4.2.1** A sub grant was received from the Association of Public Health Laboratories (APHL) to continue Basic Laboratory Information System (BLIS) activities in the country. Three IT professionals were employed as BLIS technical officers for the implementation. They provided on-site and remote technical support to all sites and interfaced all chemistry analysers with BLIS and DHIMS2.

- **4.2.2** The Laboratory Information System Technical Working Group (LISTWG) held monthly technical review meetings to discuss BLIS activities and provide technical support to the BLIS team. Some members of the group undertook monitoring and supervisory visit to all the BLIS sites to assess implementation of BLIS and to provide support to enhance implementation of the programme.

### **4.3 Equipment and Vehicle**

The Association of Public Health Laboratory donated two chemistry and two haematology analysers to support the Co-Ag. Twelve heavy duty UPS and ten heavy duty stabilisers were also procured to support the PCR machines in the country.

One of the four vehicles provided under the Co-Ag which was involved in an accident was written off by the insurance company and a compensation of GHC 40,000 was paid to the programme.

### **4.4 Stakeholders' meeting on laboratory documents**

Funding was provided under the Co-Ag to support the Ministry of Health to organise a stakeholders' meeting on the National Health Laboratory Policy (NHLP) and the National Health Laboratory Strategic Plan (NHLSP). The purpose of the meeting was to address concerns of the Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons which are hindering the launching of the documents.

### **4.5 Key Population Implementation Science Project**

The Key Population Implementation Science (KPIS) project started with the development of a TOR (Terms of reference) for the engagement of a coordinator. Subsequently a protocol was submitted for ethical clearance to pave way for implementation. The main objective of the KPIS project is to assess existing services for KPs and to recommend strategies for the implementation of targeted services to Key Populations as part of efforts to control the epidemic since KPs are drivers of the epidemic.

## **THE DELIVERY OF STRATEGIC INFORMATION ON HIV AND AIDS**

### **5.1 Publications and Reprinting**

During the period, the following documents were either developed or revised;

- Early Infant Diagnosis register and monthly returns form.
- IMAI Acute Care Manual.
- PMTCT Register and monthly return form were incorporated in ANC register.
- Adult and Paediatric client registration and follow-up booklets.

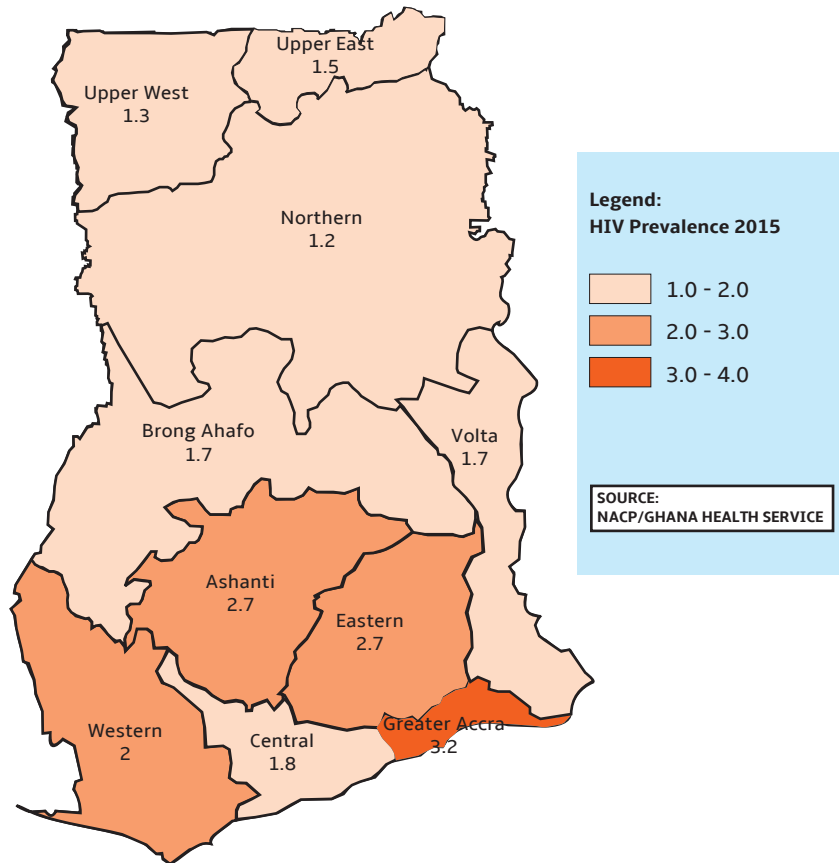
The Programme also published and disseminated the results of the 2014 HIV Sentinel Survey (HSS) and the NACP 2014 Annual Reports.

### **5.2 HIV Sentinel Survey 2015**

The Programme conducts and uses HIV Sentinel Survey (HSS) as the main tool for monitoring the trend and state of the epidemic in the country at any given time. The system is based on an annual HIV Sero Prevalence Survey conducted in Forty (40) sentinel sites using an unlinked anonymous method.

The sentinel population comprises pregnant women accessing antenatal services for the first time and clients seeking treatment for STI during the survey period. The HSS results is the primary data for the estimation and projection of HIV infection in the general population it provides a firm basis for planning and forecasting for prevention, treatment, management and care related programmes.

In the year under review, the Programme successfully disseminated the results of the 2014 HSS and undertook the 2015 survey. The prevalence among pregnant women was 1.8% as against 1.6% in 2014. Figure 5.1 is a map of Ghana showing the regional HIV prevalence.

### 5.3 Sexually Transmitted Infection Surveillance

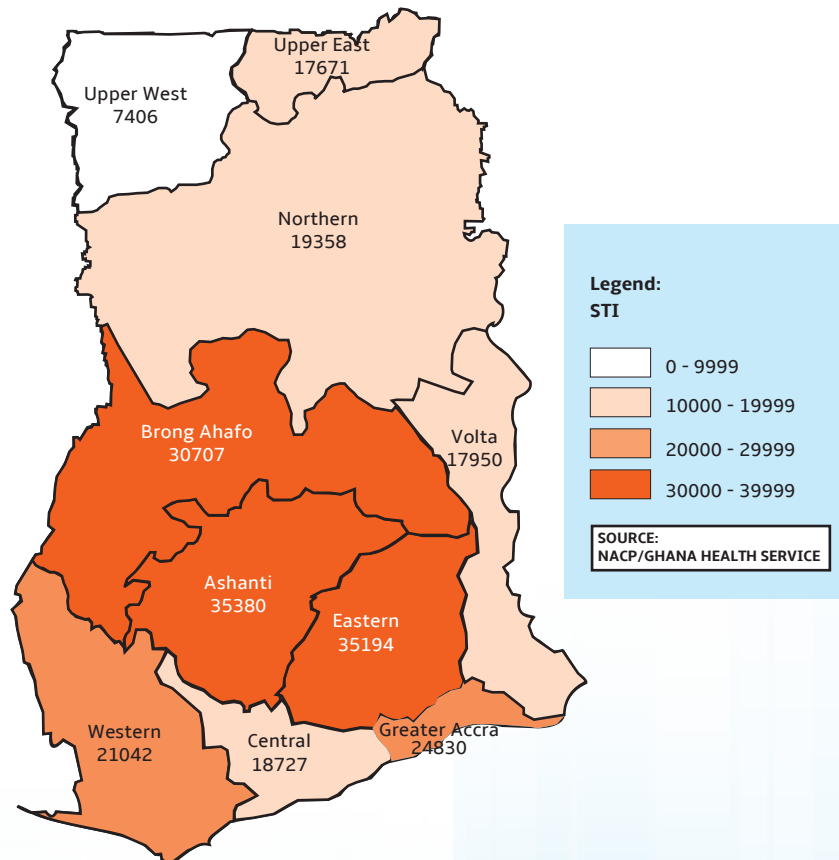
A major public health strategy for HIV prevention is early detection and syndromic management of Sexually Transmitted Infections.

In 2015, a total of 228,265 STI cases were diagnosed and treated in the country. These were female genital ulcer, male genital ulcer, urethral discharge and vaginal discharges. The relative contributions of the various regions are shown in table 5.1.

## Chapter 6.0

### **PROVISION OF ESSENTIAL TECHNICAL SUPPORT TO ALL MDAs IN THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THEIR PROGRAMMES**

Provision of technical support to various MDAs and stakeholders in their workplace HIV and AIDS programmes remained a key activity for the NACP.

The Programme participated fully in most activities of the Ghana AIDS Commission and the Country Co-ordinating Mechanism (CCM) of the Global Fund by providing technical assistance to enhance their advocacy role. The NACP supported the GAC to undertake an end-term evaluation of the 2011-2015 National Strategic Plan for HIV (NSP) and the development of the new NSP for 2016-2020. The programme Manager and officers of NACP participated in all commissioners' meetings and other technical meetings of the GAC.

Students of academic institutions such as Ghana College of Physicians and Surgeons, University of Ghana School of Medicine and Dentistry, School of Nursing and School of Public Health were not left out in trainings.

## Chapter 7.0

### FINANCIAL INFORMATION

During the year the Global Fund approved a total amount of \$ 79,460,735.76 under the New Funding model (NFM) which is expected to run for the period July 2015 to December 2017.

The Programme received a total support of \$25,015,246.29 in 2015 (January - December) from its donor partners. The Global Fund supported the programme with \$24,497,081.27 representing 98% of the total funds whilst other donors (CDC, APHL and the UNICEF) contributed \$518,165.02 representing 2% of total receipts.

The Funds were provided to support the GHS/MOH in the implementation of its strategic activities such as PMTCT, ART, and HIV Testing, HIV/TB Collaboration, Health Systems Strengthening, Programme Management and M&E.

Total expenditure in 2015 was \$13,894,605.60. A summary of the breakdown showing cumulative disbursement and expenditures as at 2015 is shown below:

## 7.1 Total Expenditure within 2015

In 2015, total expenditure under the various cost categories/Cost Groupings and SDAs/ Modules by the NACP amounted to \$ 13,894,605.60. Expenditure under NFM amounted to \$8,650,353.34 while expenditure under R8 and Others amounted to \$5,244,252.26.

The cost categories are as defined below:

### FINANCIAL SUMMARIES FOR 2015 (ACCOUNTS)

1. **Human Resource** - includes all HR expenditure under the grants
2. **Trainings** - all trainings conducted at both regional and national levels in HTC/PMTCT, Early Infant Diagnosis, Laboratory trainings etc.
3. **Health Products and Health equipment** - includes the procurement of HIV Test Kits, Laboratory Reagents and other consumables.
4. **Medicines and Pharmaceuticals** – includes all ARVs and OI drugs procured in the year.
5. **Equipment and Infrastructure** – includes Hematology and Chemical Analyzers, CD4 Machines, Air Conditioners, refurbishment etc.
6. **Planning and Administration Cost** - includes M&E, Surveillance, IE&C and all operational cost.

**Fig: 7.1a Graphical representation of 2015 total expenditure by Cost Categories**

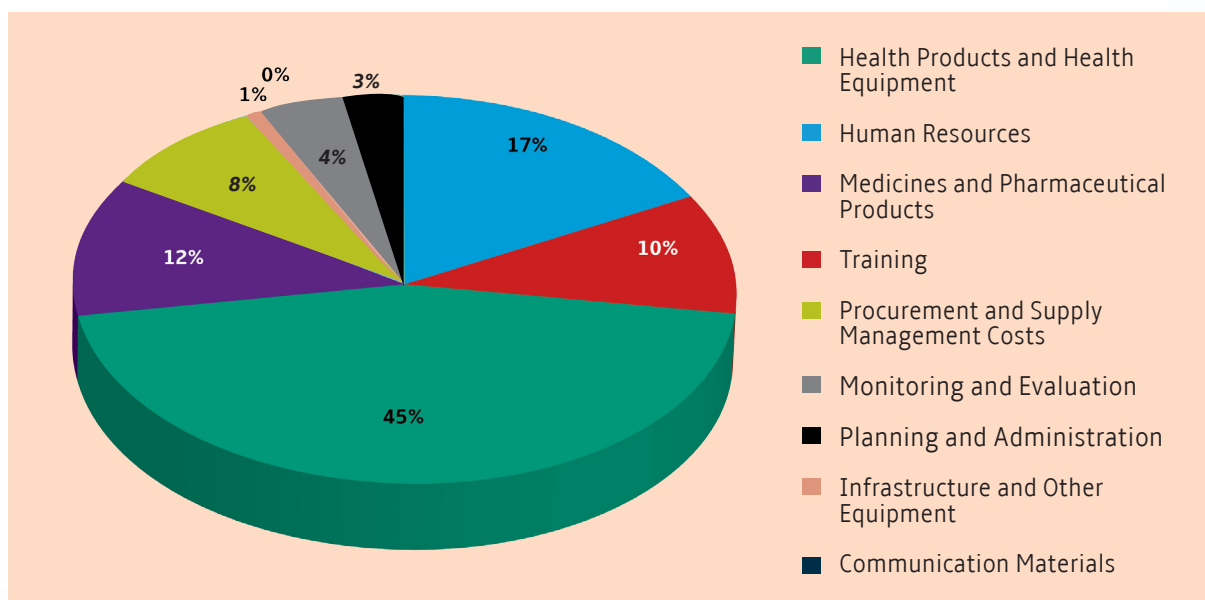
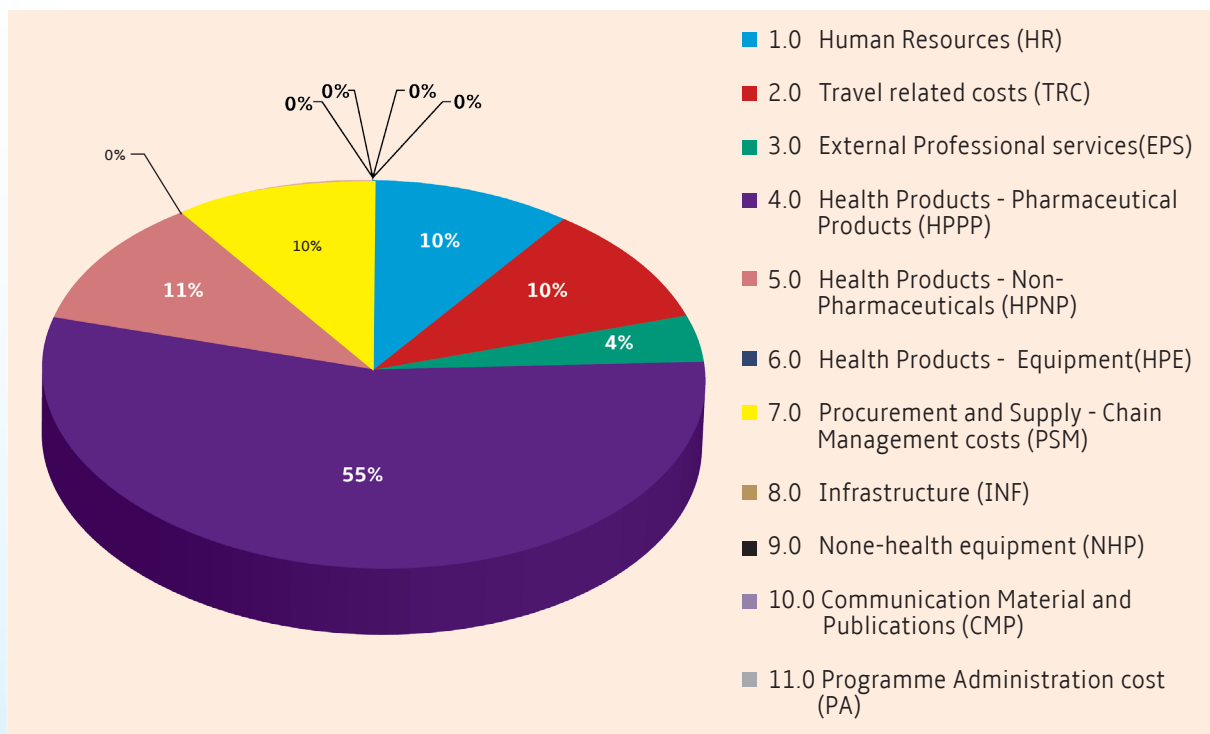

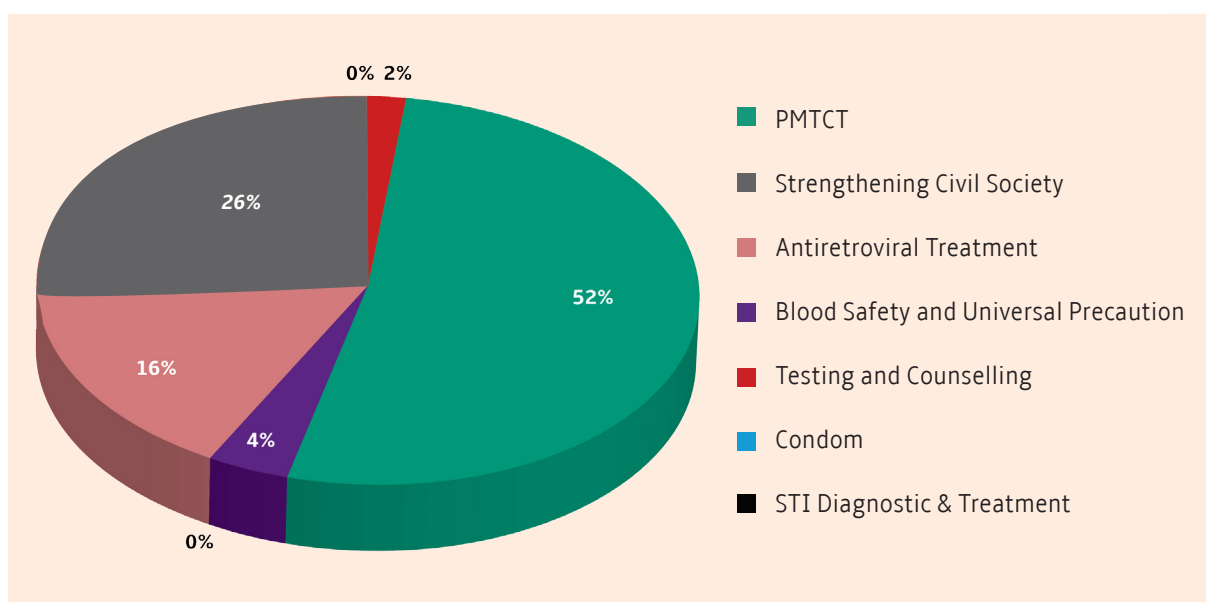
Fig: 7.1b Graphical representation of 2015 total expenditure by Cost Groupings

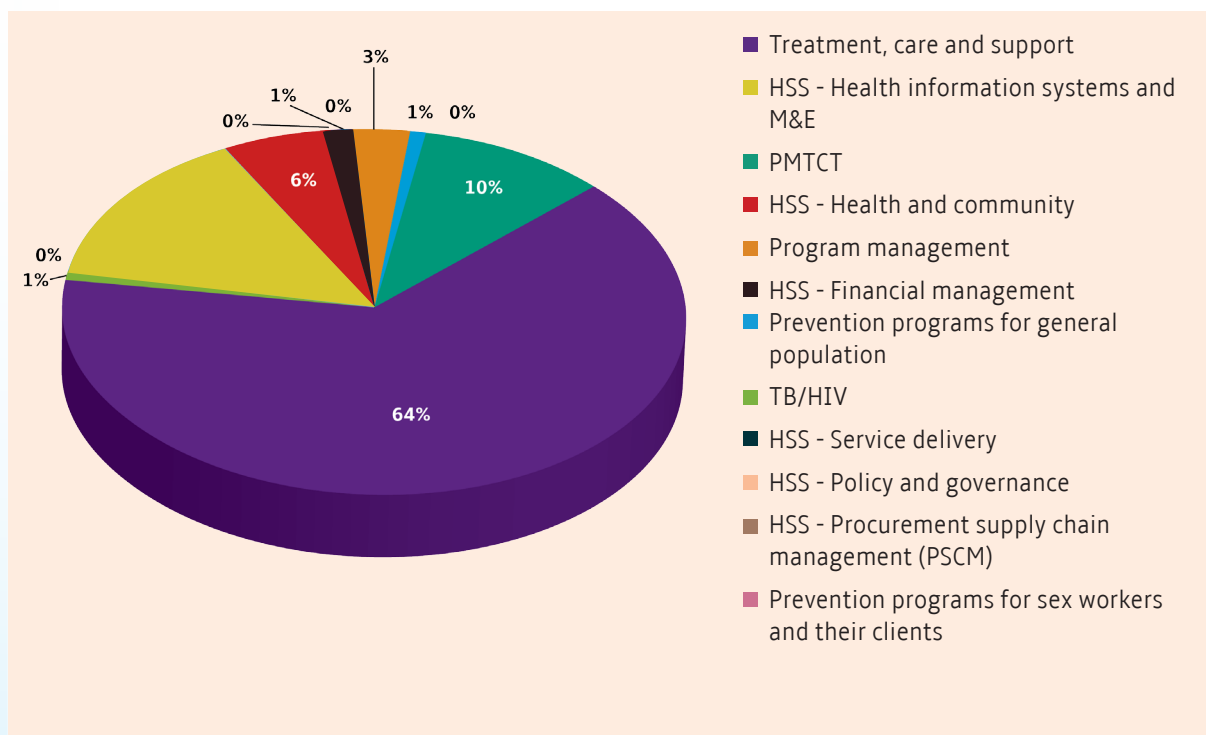
**Fig: 7.1c Graphical representation of 2015 total expenditure by Service Delivery Areas**

**Fig: 7.1d Graphical representation of 2015 total expenditure by Modules**



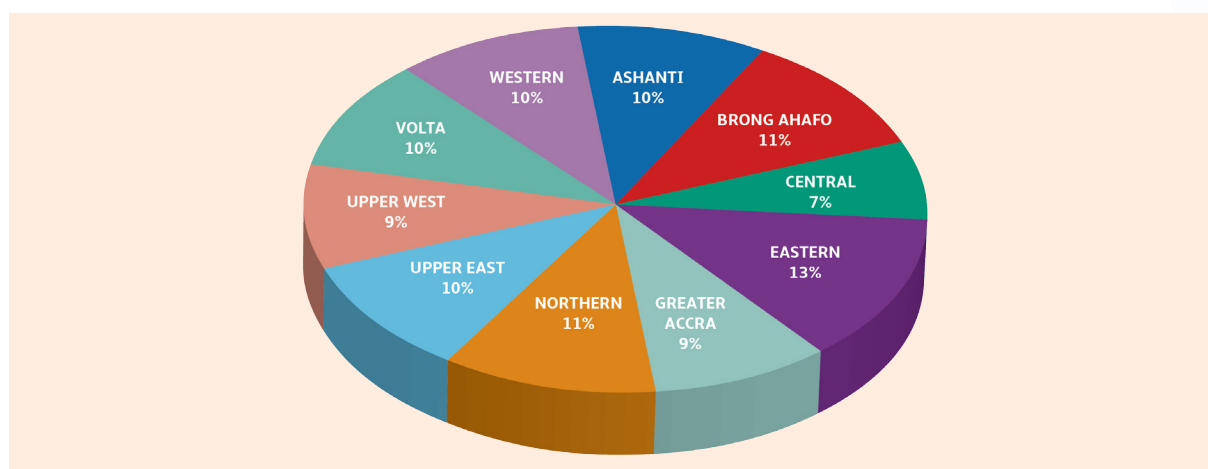
## 7.2 Financial Support to Regions

A total amount of \$9,453.85 was disbursed from NACP to all the ten regions to undertake HSS Monitoring at both regional and district levels, in 2015. Below is a table showing the actual amounts allocated to each region and a graphical representation of the amounts allocated.

## 7.3 Resource Mobilisation

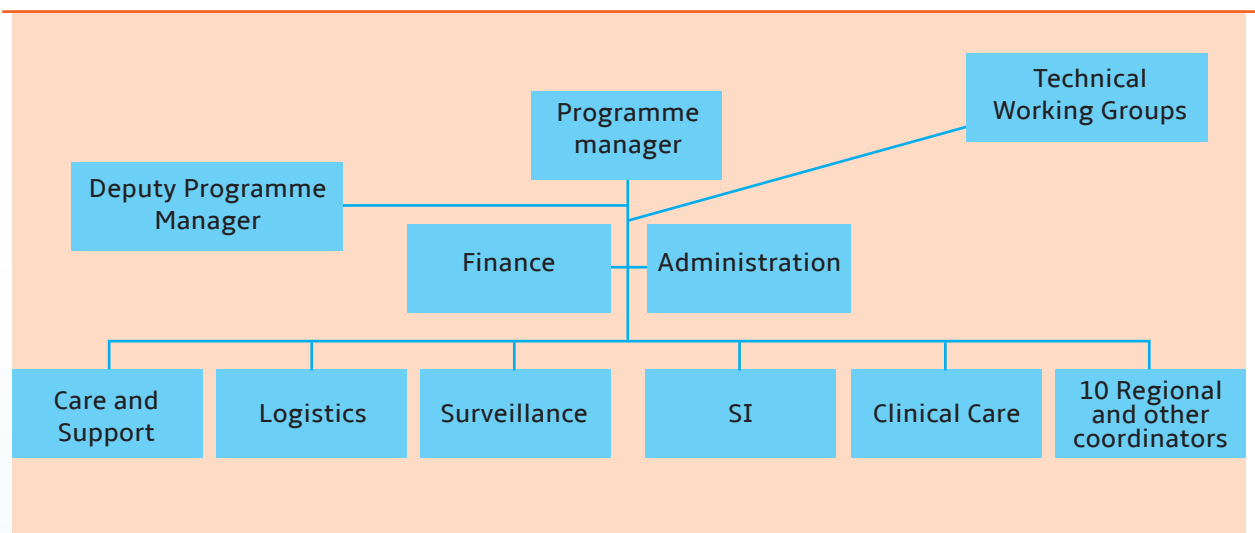
The programme has completed negotiations with PEPFAR for the approval of approximately \$23.8 million to support commodity procurement towards the ‘Treat all’ policy.

## ADMINISTRATION

### 8.1 Human Resource

In 2015 The Programme was headed by Dr. Stephen Ayisi Addo (Deputy Programme Manager) in acting capacity until appointment as the substantive Programme Manager on December 1st 2015, after the successful retirement of Dr. Nii Akwei Addo. The Programme has 29 core staff who fall within the following units: Care & Support (3), Clinical Care (1), Laboratory & Surveillance (5), IT (1), Strategic Information (4), Finance (5), and Administration and Support Services (10).

The Programme again enjoyed the technical support of the WHO, UNICEF, Procurement and Supply Directorate of the Ministry of Health (P&S/MOH), the Stores Supply and Drug Management of the Ghana Health Service (SSDM/GHS), NMIMR, Regional Health Directorates, PHRL, USAID, CDC, among others in the implementation of its planned activities.

## ❖ 8.2 Programme Management (Quality Assurance)

### • 8.2.1 Staff Meetings

Three staff meetings were held in the course of the year. In these meetings, various units provided updates of their activities. Ideas were shared, strengths of others were tapped into and decisions impacting on programme activities were taken.

### • 8.2.2 Technical Meetings

Four meetings of the Joint Technical Working Group on ART and HIVDR were held in the year under review. The Laboratory Information Technical Working Group also held six meetings.

The Programme participated actively in weekly meetings of the Public Health Division, Weekly Directors and Unit Heads Meetings and the biannual meetings of the Public Health Directorate of the Ghana Health Service. It also participated in the HIV Partnership Forum, Health Summit, and the Senior Managers Meetings of the Ghana Health Service.

### • 8.2.3 Review Meetings

As has become the norm, the NACP and NTP held a joint annual review meeting and a midyear review meeting. In these meetings, stakeholders and regional teams were invited to deliberate on activities during the year, the challenges and way forward.

### • 8.2.4 NACP annual retreat

Staff of the National AIDS/STI Control Programme (NACP) and the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), Ghana office participated in a one week retreat at Elmina Beach Hotel. The main objective of this retreat was to discuss activities to include preparation of action plans within the PEPFAR, CDC Co-Ag and the New Funding Model for the Global Fund (NFM-GF). The Co-Ag and NACP annual reports were also finalised.

### • 8.2.5 International Meetings

The PM and other staff participated in various international meetings as follows:

- Mortality Analysis Workshop at the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis and Malaria, Geneva, Switzerland, 15th to 19th June 2015.
- Training on Management of HIV Programmes for Commercial Sex Workers in West and Central Africa, Saly, Senegal, 21st – 25th September 2015.
- Study tour on integration of PMTCT/EID/Paediatric HIV Services into Maternal, Newborn and Child Health Services, 12th to 16th October 2015, Zambia.
- Second Regional Key Population Conference, Lome, Togo, 26th to 30th October 2015.
- UNAIDS /WHO Meeting on Plausible Evaluation with Global Fund Country Team, 9th to 13th November, 2015, Geneva, Switzerland.
- Regional Consultation on eMTCT and Paediatric Care in West and Central Africa, Dakar, Senegal, 16th to 18th November 2015

## **MONITORING AND SUPERVISION**

Monitoring forms a key part of NACP's activities in order to follow the progress of implementation of the health sector activities of HIV and AIDS. Monitoring and sites support visits were undertaken by national and regional officers of the Ghana Health Service.

Two support visits were undertaken to the Volta Region and Upper East Regions by the Acting Programme Manager, in addition to others undertaken by programme officers. During the period a financial and assets verification visits were undertaken to address specific financial issues. A PMTCT specific monitoring and supervisory visit supported by UNICEF was also undertaken jointly with the Family Health Division of GHS.

### **Co-Ag Monitoring visits**

One monitoring visit was undertaken by a team of GHS and CDC officers to all eight regions with PCR machines. The purpose was to access advanced testing services and to provide technical and other support as deemed necessary. The UER and UWR are the outstanding regions without a PCR machine.

The Site Improvement Monitoring System (SIMS) programme was introduced into Co-Ag activities sometime during the year. The goal of SIMS was to increase the impact of PEPFAR programmes on the HIV epidemic through standardized monitoring of quality at the site, above-site level and community focusing on key programme areas. Some selected sites in the Greater Accra and Eastern regions were selected to participate in the programme.

## CHALLENGES

### ❖ 10.1 Central Medical Store Fire

The biggest setback in the year under review was the razing down by fire of the Central Medical Stores on 13th January. This resulted in the destruction of several commodities initially estimated to the tune of three hundred and fifty six million, one hundred and fifty-four thousand and eight Ghana cedis and twenty-eighty pesewas (356,154,008.28). The commodities lost included essential medicines including ARVs and TB medicines, EPI consumables, medical equipment, HIV and malaria Rapid Diagnostic testkits, condoms, Ebola relief items and Personal Protective Equipment. This created an acute need for HIV related commodities worth almost 35million Ghana Cedis though the total loss was estimated at 43.4million Ghana Cedis. Hence appeals were made to partners to fill the gap resulting in a donation of some ARVs by WAHO. The Global Fund ensured that the gap was effectively filled by frontloading commodities to be procured in 2016. The commodity stock by close of the year had improved significantly as shown in the table 10.1.

## ❖ 10.2 Human Resource

The frequent transfer of service providers both within and outside the facilities created human resource gaps which affected the delivery of services. The situation unfortunately is the same. The lack of regular refresher trainings for key services also affected performance at facility level prior to the PMTCT option B plus refreshers. Gaps in HR strength within the NACP also persisted, however the programme liaised with the Human Resource Division to start the recruitment of additional data officers and other programme officers.

## ❖ 10.3 Limited Infrastructure

Infrastructure to ensure effective and efficient provision of HIV services was also limited. Unfortunately no funds were provided in the New Funding Model (NFM) for infrastructural refurbishment or expansion. Efforts at refurbishing existing ware houses have stalled due to lack of funds. An example is the Greater Accra Regional Medical Store. Other warehouses also have limited storage spaces. The need for increased storage space was heightened by the loss of the CMS. The increasing client load would also require more space for client folders. Laboratory infrastructure is necessary to support the scale-up of ART sites especially to new Directly Observed Therapy (DOTs) corners.

## ❖ 10.4 Procurement Delays

It must be highlighted that delays in procurement processes for key logistics affected the Programmes pace of implementation and financial burn rate. Despite the increased advocacy to improve the situation, not much progress was made as some requests lingered on into the ensuing year.

## WAY FORWARD

### 11.1 Procurement and HR Recruitment

The programme will intensify efforts to advocate for a timely procurement of goods and services and fast track the recruitment of the needed human resource for enhanced performance.

### 11.2 Improving HIV Commodity Distribution

The Programme carried out scheduled delivery of bulk consignment of commodities to the various Regional Medical Stores to enhance the smooth delivery of HIV commodities and hopes to continue this way. The Imperial Health Science (HIS) is delivering to the RMS under the coordination of the MOH Procurement and Supply unit and it's hoped that delivery from RMSs to facilities (last mile) should be fully operational in the ensuing year.

### 11.3 Implementing new initiatives

Important guidelines and policies would be revised to facilitate the implementation of new 90-90-90 aspirational targets and WHO recommendation to treat all PLHIV irrespective of CD4 count and clinical criteria. To this extent, various training manuals, data collection and reporting tools would be updated to facilitate the re-orientation of service providers.

### 11.4 Data Strengthening and Monitoring

A lot of effort would be focused on strengthening data management after completing the ART data cleaning and cohort analysis exercise to renew the system for client monitoring whilst in clinical and ART care. The NACP intends to initiate the E-tracker system of client follow-up in collaboration with the PPME division.

### 11.5 Improving overall Programmatic Performance

Linked to the improvement of commodities to PMTCT sites to enhance coverage of pregnant women on ART is the need to significantly bridge the gap in EID. Overall paediatric care would be enhanced through the implementation of an accelerated paediatric plan for HIV. Intensified re-orientation, supportive supervision and targeted mentorship of service providers will be a priority for the coming year.

## CONCLUSION

The approval of the grant for the New Funding Model (NFM) in 2015, enabled the NACP to carry out planned activities to a very large extent. The programme, in collaboration with Stakeholders, would continue and complete all other outstanding activities as agreed by the NFM and even exceed targets riding on the momentum of new initiatives and aspirational targets.
